This great opportunity is free to all Town Residents and Businesses. **You will be asked to prove residency, so make sure you have your water bill and/or a form of ID showing your physical address with you when you bring your items to discard.** Residents who are physically unable to bring their items to the shop should contact Vaughn Mead, Public Works Director to arrange a special services pick-up. ➤ Construction Debris	➤ Household Trash
➤ Yard & Tree Material (<i>no soil/dirt/rocks</i>)	➤ Junk Cars
➤ Scrap Metal (<i>no vehicles or vehicle frames</i>)	➤ Hazardous Materials
➤ Propane/ Gas Cylinders (<i>valves removed</i>)	➤ Wet paint cans
➤ Refrigerators and Freezers– <i>with certification of Refrigerant removed</i>	➤ Used Oil
➤ Tires – <i>Separated from the Rims (\$5.00 each)</i>	➤ Animal or Human Waste
➤ Dried Paint cans	➤ Gasoline
➤ Stoves/Ovens (<i>no Microwave Ovens</i>)	➤ Appliances with coolant intact
➤ Dishwashers	➤ Televisions, Computers and other electronic waste
➤ Water Heaters and Furnaces	➤ Batteries
➤ Wood Stoves	➤ Equipment/Tractor Tires
	➤ Mattresses (Box springs are okay)
